LADY LINNIUE FOUND DEAD

A group of hunters returning from a trip on Witvon's Thumb report that the country villa of Lady Jyin Linniue and her husband has been razed to the ground.

According to the hunters, the home appears to have been burned down but not before multiple people were killed. The hunters reported bodies littered about the property.

Linniue, a once prominent figure in local politics retired from public life around five years ago following a massive scandal that rocked the Blades Council. The scandal was first reported by Master Times and later investigations by other outlets confirmed the findings. Linniue, while not personally named in the scandal found herself politically isolated and later wrote that she saw the whole thing as "an opportunity to step aside."

Linniue was a prominent and devout follower of Waukeen, making multiple sizable donations to the church in her day. The temple will hold a ceremony in her honor later this week.

Linniue retired to the countryside in a bid to escape the hustle of city life following a long career in politics as a diplomat for the Blades. She served for decades as the ambassador to the Vast in Raven's Bluff.

BLADES COUNCIL DECREE: CONSERVE WATER THIS MONTH
